THE ORIGINAL PRIDE FLAG



Designed by artist Gilbert Baker in 1978 after requests from Harvey Milk to create a

symbol of pride for the gay community.
Baker originally designed the flag with 8 colours. (hot pink for sex, red for life, orange for healing, yellow for sunlight, green for nature, turquoise for art, indigo for harmony, and violet for spirit).

Orange = Healing

Yellow = Sunlight

Green = Nature

Indigo/Blue = Serenity

Violet = Spirit

Two Feathers: Represent the balance of masculine and feminine spirits, mirroring the concept of Two-Spirit individuals who embody both.
